


PLANTING 2 BILLION TREES

Planting trees is essential for a growing community like Milton. Healthy tree coverage and a vibrant urban canopy is great for our air quality, our health, for shade and our regional biodiversity!

Our government is committed to planting 2 billion trees over the next ten years. 40,000 have already been planted here in Halton.

I was thrilled to announce \$270,000 for over 50,000 trees to be planted right here in the Halton Region, and 200 mature trees in town. That's a new tree for every family in Milton! Thank you to Town of Milton and Conservation Halton for their efforts!







\$10/DAY CHILDCARE

This past year has been difficult for many families in Milton, especially those with young children. Raising a family is expensive, which is why our government just introduced the young child supplement for the Canada Child Benefit, a temporary support of up to \$1200 per child under 6, benefiting over 2.1 million children.

High quality affordable childcare is a necessity. Through budget 2021, we will spend up to \$30 billion over the next 5 years to build a Canada wide early learning and childcare system. Our goal is to bring fees for regulated childcare down to average \$10 per day within the next 5 years.



NEW HORIZONS FOR SENIORS FUNDING IN MILTON

RURAL BROADBAND

Canada-wide

Access to high-quality, high-speed Internet is essential in our increasingly digital and online world. The pandemic reinforced our dependence on high-speed Internet to work, go to school, access virtual health care, and connect with one another. Many of those in rural communities have been disproportionately impacted due to lack of reliable internet.

Last November, our government announced the launch of the Universal Broadband Fund – a \$2.75 billion investment that will help connect every Canadian to high-speed internet. An integral part of the Universal Broadband Fund is the Rapid Response Stream, which consists of \$150 million to fund shovel-ready projects that will bring high-speed internet to communities by the end of this year.

Our Local Community

I was so happy to make the important announcement that our government is investing **\$1.7 million** to connect over **1500 rural households** in local communities; Moffat, Campbellville, Haltonville, Nassageweya, Rural Burlington and south Milton.

Since 2015, our government has approved programs and projects that will connect at least 1.7 million Canadians to better, faster internet. In Ontario alone, we have already approved 98 projects, totaling over \$250 million in funding, which will connect close to **90,000 households** to broadband.

HOUSING AFFORDABILITY

Affordable housing has long been an issue in Canada, and the pandemic has only exacerbated existing social inequalities and the hardships faced by Canadians experiencing housing insecurity or homelessness.

Adequate housing is a fundamental human right which is why it is important that our government has invested in speeding up the construction, the repair and support of affordable housing units.

The \$1 billion Rapid Housing Initiative (RHI), is investing over \$367 million to support the creation of over 1100 permanent affordable units for individuals and families in Ontario, including 171 units for Indigenous people and 108 units for Women and Children.

\$3.9M IN TRANSIT FUNDING FOR MILTON



With Milton being one of the fastest growing communities in Canada, public transportation is an essential element towards growth and prosperity. This is why our government is committed to investing in transit infrastructure in Milton.

Under the Investing in Canada plan, our government invested over **\$3.9 million** to build a new Transit Operations Facility in Milton.

Sustainable design practices will be used in the construction of the facility, providing residents with a greener, more reliable and safer form of transportation.

HOUSE OF COMMONS BILLS

Here are a few of the Bills I was most proud to support and see pass through the House.

Bill C-4 (COVID-19 Response Measures)

Along with Bills C-9 and C-24, our government has expanded social benefits for Canadians. The new Canada Recovery Benefit, Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit and Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit have helped millions of Canadians return to financial stability during the pandemic.

Bill C-6 (Banning Conversion Therapy)

This Bill criminalizes the practice of inducing children to adopt a specific sexual orientation or gender identity. This unscientific practice has been discredited internationally as paramount to torture.

Bill C-7 (Medical Assistance in Dying)

We affirmed our commitment to human rights and disability inclusion in this landmark legislation which balanced the autonomy of disabled people with the importance of free and lasting consent in assisted dying.

Bill C-12 (Net Zero Emissions by 2050)

We are committed to balancing Canada's carbon footprint in a manageable and transparent way, so we created a series of benchmarks to help Canada achieve our emissions standards within our lifetimes.

INDIGENOUS AND NORTHERN AFFAIRS COMMITTEE WORK

Emergency Session

Following the horrific discovery of 215 Indigenous children buried at the site of the Kamloops Indian Residential School, I called an emergency Committee session. We heard from witnesses and officials that testified to the horrors of that tragedy and assisted in planning the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action. Our government is committed to completing them, with 80% completed or substantially developed.

UNDRIP

With my committee colleagues, I worked hard to pass Bill C-15, *The United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act*. This commits the government to making all laws consistent with the Declaration. It is an important step in furthering reconciliation, and is a crucial building block in fully, respecting, protecting and fulfilling the rights of Indigenous peoples. I'm pleased to say that this Bill was made law on June 21, 2021.

SUPPORTING LOCAL

Local businesses are the heart of our community, adding to the vibrancy of our town and reflecting the diversity of Milton.

I have been proud to support our local shops throughout the pandemic and I recognized some of them on a national scale when I made a statement in the House of Commons to highlight local restaurants that people of Milton love and should continue to support.

Our government has also been working hard to provide support for what are the hardest hit sectors during this pandemic. We introduced the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy to help employers keep their employees on the payroll. We offered an additional top-up subsidy of 25% and extended the program for everyone to summer 2021 to support them and to help fewer Canadians face unemployment.

CANADA SUMMER JOBS

Our government introduced the Canada Summer Jobs program to help students gain summer employment so that they can develop necessary skills for when they transition into the labour force. This program also helps local businesses create positions they may not otherwise be able to fund on their own. This year, we have been able to help **94 organizations** employ **565 youth**, by investing **\$1,688,707** in Milton. This investment helps our businesses, our youth, and ultimately, our community.

\$80M FOR CANADA'S ACTIVE RECOVERY

Canadians rely on sport, physical activity and recreation for our mental and physical health, and the pandemic has made access even more difficult than before. Sport has a way of bringing people together and promoting community among Canadians of all backgrounds. Last year I created a working group of MPs from across Canada to put together a plan to support community and grassroots sport and recreation programs to ensure that every Canadian has access to high-quality, affordable physical activity programming. I am thrilled that as a result of that teamwork, and for the first time ever our government is investing \$80 Million over the next two years to make sure Canadians have an active re-start. We are looking forward to funding things like free swimming lessons, sport for development programs, physical literacy for youth and accessible family activities for all. As a kinesiologist and Olympic athlete, I feel like this is one of my unique contributions as an MP, and I'm really proud of these investments.

LOCAL FOOD INFRASTRUCTURE



Over \$305,000 for local food security projects for community partners like Community Living North Halton, Lunchbox Café, Country Heritage Park, the Salvation Army, Milton Halal Food Bank and

\$128,345 for Food For Life's new refrigerated food truck, to ensure they can continue to rescue fresh food and deliver it to where it can make a difference!

SAFE RETURN TO SCHOOL

\$25Million to our **schools in Halton** to foster a safe and healthy environment for our educators, students, parents, and school staff. Projects include HVAC renovations to improve air quality, investing in outdoor play and learn facilities, installing water bottle refilling stations to improve access to safe drinking water, and investing in network and broadband infrastructure.





















IN THE WORKS

Early Learning and Childcare

Often times parents, typically mothers, are confronted with high daycare costs which can act as a deterrent in returning into the workforce. This is why we are working on getting each of the provinces to sign off on agreements for \$10 a day child care.

Public Transit

Since 2015, we have invested in 1,300 public transit projects for communities across Canada, including subway and light-rail extensions, zero-emission transportation, and active trails and bike lanes. Through these investments, we support good middle-class jobs, creating better commutes, fighting climate change, and helping make life easier and more affordable for Canadians.

High Speed Rail

It is important for everyone to have access to safe, reliable, efficient and environmentally friendly transportation. As we look to transition away from our dependency on fuel, our government has announced \$491.2 million over a period of 6 years for infrastructure projects that will support the high frequency rail project.

Fairer Taxes to Help Everyday Canadians

Budget 2021 provides for a number of innovative tax solutions to ensure that the wealthiest Canadians pay their fair share. A luxury goods tax on cars and personal planes over \$100,000; and boats over \$250,000, will ensure that extravagant purchases can go on to benefit all Canadians. Tackling tax evasion and considering a one-time wealth tax can help make our tax system work for the benefit of all Canadians.

LOOKING AHEAD

I've been proud to represent Milton for almost two years now in Ottawa. Our local businesses, charitable organizations, and the hardworking people and families, have persevered through this pandemic, and our government has worked to help and support you along the way. Whether through programs like CERB and the CRB; the Emergency Wage or Rent Subsidies, or the community organizations supports our government has been listening to your concerns and working to meet them.

But our work is not yet done. Vaccination numbers are steadily improving, with almost 700,000 doses administered in Halton region, and many more on the way. Our government's ambitious 2021 Budget is being steadily rolled out, with a comprehensive childcare plan on the horizon. Our future is looking bright, but it is up to us to build back better. Get vaccinated, get your second dose, and keep calling and emailing our office. I'm here to serve Milton and fight for your interests. Let's build a better future together, Milton.
